

Why is Pivotal needed?

Northern Ireland faces many economic and social challenges, such as economic under-performance, struggling public services, poverty and inequality.

But serious discussion of key policy issues is often limited.

Many of the public are disengaged from policy debate and disillusioned with traditional politics. Pivotal aims to improve the public policy debate by providing independent, evidence-based challenge to government, and giving more people a voice in public debate.

Elsewhere in the UK and Ireland, think tanks provide a vital challenge to government and play an important role in shaping public policy, but no wide-ranging think tanks exist in Northern Ireland.

Pivotal uses evidence-based research to encourage and inform public debate, and works to bring about better public policy. We do this research ourselves or we commission it from others.

We involve a wide range of people in public debate, particularly those whose voices are marginalised at present.

We bring people together from different sectors and with different experiences, to share their insights and help produce better outcomes.

We do research, run events, facilitate discussions and engage with social media.
